Please submit ONE application for each Class Topic E-Mail completed form to faculty@handbellmusicians.org

National Seminar 2017 is July 11-15 at the Hyatt Regency Orange County in Garden Grove, California. We are seeking submissions for classes and faculty to present at the event. When preparing your application, please note the following:

- Those submitting must have their own individual Handbell Musician membership or be the primary contact for an organization's Handbell Musician membership.
- Consider all aspects of handbell musicianship in all settings as you develop your class ideas. The committee strives to select a wide variety of classes for all constituencies of our membership.
- Those submitting more than one class topic will be given priority consideration.
- Those interested in teaching at the event must submit a separate Class Submission Application for each
 class topic/idea they would like to present. Completed applications must be emailed to
 faculty@handbellmusicians.org.
- Any applicant who has not taught at a National Seminar or Pinnacle in the past three years (since Atlanta 2014) must provide two letters of reference from individuals who have observed the applicant teaching within the past 12 months. These letters must be sent directly to <u>faculty@handbellmusicians.org</u> by the person providing the reference.
- Deadline for submission is October 15. Applicants will be notified of committee selections by January 1,
 2017
- Class sessions at National Seminar are 75-minutes long. Topics may be offered as single classes or multisession courses. Single-session classes will usually be offered twice in the schedule during the event.
 Multi-session courses will only be offered once in the schedule.

Terms & Compensation

Selected faculty will be compensated as follows:

Local (resides within a 50-mile radius of the event site) or Out-of-Town Teaching Only ONE Class Topic

- \$40 honorarium per 75-minute class session taught.
- Option to attend classes and concerts during the event at no cost.
- If at least two class topics are taught, Full Event Registration including all provided meals.

Out-of-Town Teaching TWO or More Class Topics

- \$425 reimbursement of round-trip airfare to the event.
- OR mileage paid at the prevailing IRS charitable rate for miles driven to and from the event up to a total of \$425.
- One half of a shared hotel room at the official event hotel for each night the clinician teaches a class session at the event. Faculty are responsible for securing their own roommate and making their own hotel arrangements at the conference hotel.
- Full Event Registration including all provided meals.

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Equipment Needed: Please consider the following when determining your equipment needs for your class:

- First identify your absolute minimum need to teach the class and then you may add "nice-to-have" additions.
- Please plan for attendees to share equipment, not for each participant to have their own for the length of the class.
- Equipment needed beyond the basic bells and chimes, such as percussion or Orff instruments, etc., should be clearly defined.
- Also, indicate if additional equipment is something you will bring with you.
- Note, we are no longer able to provide small percussion (tambourine-size or smaller.) If you need small percussion, you will need to bring it yourself.
- If you do not request equipment in advance it will not be available at Seminar.
- We will no longer provide mallets for classes. Instead, registrants will be asked to bring mallets with them to the event. Please note in your class description if mallets will be required.
- Due to increases in the costs of renting certain audio/video equipment, we will no longer be able to provide sound amplification for laptops or other personal electronics. If you plan to use sound files in your class, the equipment committee can assist you in identifying sources for securing your own travel-friendly speaker options.
- Plan to bring any small, non-traditional items with you to the event. These items are difficult to get on loan and even more difficult to track and return to the lender.
- Please only request equipment that is absolutely necessary to a successful class presentation.
